Secretary's Report: Minutes for August 13th 2015 were approved and accepted.

Treasurer's Report: Louis presented his report (details below) and said that he now has access on-line to our People's Bank account and also announced that Laurie Boyd is retiring as our payroll accountant... a loss for the library. Louis will investigate other payroll processing options. Karina recommended that we invest some endowment money in the Vanguard Life Stategy Fund with no fees for transferring. Discussion followed.

- On Tuesday, August 11th, Joan Rech's Book Event about hiking trails in Wilmington was well attended with 42 people present.
- The Wilmington Historical Society would love to accept the Christine Boyd bell collection which was donated to the library (or any local organization that would display them) in 1983. Karina moved and Louis 2nd to transfer the collection and the display cases to the historical society for display in their building, so voted.
- Allyson and Harriette will represent the library at the Memorial Hall jazz benefit concert on Saturday the 19th.

- Our annual Story Time apple picking event is scheduled for Friday Oct. 2nd at 12:30PM at Pine Hill Orchard. Also the last StoryWalk and end-of-the-year party will be on Friday Oct. 9th at 11:30AM.
- Story walks at Molly Stark State Park have slowed down since school started. Highlights included a talk by Librarian Amy Mullen about early literacy and brain development.

Ideas were discussed and Louis, as Treasurer, suggested that our Friends group should become a 501-c-3 entity and take over their own finances if they intend to continue to raise their own money.
