Update of project

Mark Blanchard gives status report:

Although there have been several small hiccups with construction, the team has been able to keep on schedule, with only 16 potential change orders totaling \$17,000.

Breadloaf, NBF, and the Chiefs meet every Wednesday @ 10:00am to discuss progress and any issues/questions that arise.

The south driveway will be moved by about 4 feet in a gentle curve because of how close propane tanks are to road and to provide enough space for the bollards.

A large deduct in air vac system (apparatus bay filtration) anticipated.

Discussion on making air vac system more energy efficient.

Disconnects for generator planned on outside of facility are redundant. Discussion on making a kill switch, instead of a full disconnect. Generator itself also has an off button. This change could potentially save a couple thousand dollars.

Hayden reorganized heating layout- added a heating zone & saved money.

Intent to complete base course of paving before winter, and final course in spring.

Breadloaf and NBF receive good reviews from the Chief's regarding their attention to detail, and overall planning and engagement. Jessica Lee Smith comments on how she has seen workers out regardless of the weather, working hard to stay on schedule.

Chiefs are working with 911 to get the road off of Beaver Street where the new Public Safety Facility will reside named "**First Lieutenant Mark Dooley Memorial Drive**".
