Request for Funding Through the 1% Local Option Tax Fund

Describe in detail the purpose and specific use of the funding:

We are seeking funding for a new heating system for the entire 55,000 square foot building. All of the heated space is served by what is essentially a one-zone boiler with a back-up boiler of identical size and age. In spite of frequent repairs and new valves for many of the tenant-occupied rooms, the system is not reliable when winter arrives and we know that it is past the end of its useful life. We are especially concerned now that Beaver Brook Children's School will be opening in November and doubling the number of daily tenants who need to stay warm.

Both oil-fired boilers were last updated during the 1981 building renovation. When we first acquired the building in October, 2017 the annual usage was 17,000 gallons but our subsequent insulation projects have helped get the annual usage down to 14,000 gallons.

There are frequent outages which require a scramble by board members, volunteers and even tenants to restart the system. Lack of heat on a cold January day this year resulted in a plumbing leak in our meeting room that took months to repair.

We prepared an RFP in February, 2021 for an engineering firm to design the most energy efficient and economical system for our building. We selected Savoy Engineering at the cost of \$8,000 and we are in the process of putting an RFP out for bid. Our best estimate is that a new system (and removal of the existing boilers) will cost \$100,000 which will include asbestos abatement removal for the old boilers.

Describe the need for the funding and any other information:

An Income and Expense statement for our fiscal year ended June 30, 2021 is attached.

While we have had success obtaining grants (including a recent one from Brattleboro Development Credit Corporation for \$8,000) and by fundraising (the Jeep raffle donation from the Anstatt family raised \$22,000 for us), we are dependent on rental income to keep operating. We are optimistic that we have enough cash on hand to continue smaller renovation projects that will help lower the oil usage but we need assistance with the big ticket item.

Introduction

OSEC purchased the building in October 2017 and the agreed upon value was \$150,000 which is what the town used as a tax assessment. At that time, we had one anchor tenant, Windham Southwest Supervisory Union, which is still there today and they have just renewed their lease. The following two large tenants came after the "Make it on Main Street" contest – 802 Fitness and Butter Mountain Bakery. Our newest anchor tenant is Beaver Brook Children's School and is licensed to care for thirty children including infants, toddlers, and three to five year olds. We currently have eight full time businesses and six part time businesses for a total of thirty-six people in the Community Center on a daily basis. The gym and the meeting rooms are used daily with groups including Pickle Ball, Rec, basketball open gym, volleyball, and a SASH adult walking group. The Realtor's Association hold meetings in the meeting room and the fire and police department recently held a fundraising basketball game with the proceeds going to the community center. In addition, the Town of Wilmington has begun using the community center as a polling place.

Renovations and repairs to date include roof repairs, renovation of the lobby, cafeteria (thanks to a grant from the Mark Dooley Foundation); and the meeting room (former school library). We have also installed new first floor hallway flooring, front brick walkway, refinished gym floor done by volunteers, and new gym LED lighting. We have replaced twenty windows and recently completed renovations of the first floor bathrooms.

Total expenditures: \$279,726.62.

Five Year Plan

Fundraising

To complete our renovations to date, we have received funding from the following sources:

- 1. Wilmington 1% fund to repair roof and insulate lobby and meeting room.
- 2. Mark Dooley Foundation to renovate cafeteria.
- 3. National Life Foundation Main Street Grant to renovate lobby.
- 4. United Way Grant to renovate lobby.
- 5. USDA Grant to renovate bathrooms.
- 6. Private donations.
- 7. Sold brick pavers to construct new walkway.
- 8. Donated jeep for raffle.
- 9. Farm to Table dinners every summer.
- 10. Local recreation program donations (i.e. Pickleball, Valley Youth Sports, etc.).

Future fundraising will include pursuing grants, Farm to Table dinner, selling commemorative bricks, local recreation programs and we are currently working on an appeal letter (which will become an annual appeal). We are mailing to homeowners in Wilmington, Dover, and Whitingham.

Future Renovations

Our most pressing need at this time is a new heating system. Because of the cost, we plan to do this in two phases (please see bid) beginning this spring. Future renovations are listed below.
