- I attended a webinar about integrating sustainability into strategic planning.
- The Winterplace Festival will be taking place on February 11<sup>th</sup> and the library will attend again as a form of outreach.
- Much of my time this month was spent trying to get people to answer phone calls and emails. Contractors, service people, getting questions answered... Not easy in December!
- When not serving patrons, we spent much of our desk time working on pre-renovation work. We are systematically pulling books and adding genre stickers. I've been going through our supplies and files, looking to see what can toss or rehome, as well as identifying what will need to stay behind the circulation desk.
- I got a note from Demco letting us know that they have received a shipping date from their suppliers, so all of the furniture is on the way to them. They still will not give me an install date yet.
- I have started working on employee evaluations and will have preliminary drafts available on Tuesday.
