- Now that the renovation is (almost) done, I am concentrating on two areas:
  - 1. Summer Programming
  - 2. Sustainability Project
- For summer programming, Angela has an excellent calendar of events scheduled for kids. For adults, I will be running a DIY craft evening. There will be three Thursdays in August that we will do DIY projects. They are homemade beeswax wraps, pizza pan wreaths, and homemade lavender lotion. If these projects take off, I will consider making them a regular program throughout the year.
- We have presented two programs in our new space thus far: Container Gardening and Respecting the Wild Ones. Container Gardening had an attendance of 5, while 12 people attended the Abenaki program. The space works beautifully for programs and we look forward to using it many more times in the future!
- I took a brief hiatus from working on the Sustainability Project during our renovation, but now I am working on a document that will encompass many of the items on our action checklist. It will include outdoor issues, like water usage, drainage, and light pollution and indoor items such as materials management and air quality. Once this is finished, it should check off numerous items from the action checklist and get us close to finishing.
- The Grand Reopening Party was a smash! We had many community members come out to see the new library and check out books! Our community has been very excited about the changes and we love to see them use the space the way we envisioned including teens in the Young Adult room!
- The library vegetable gardens are starting to pop. The plants include our perennial ground cherries, tomatoes, kale, amaranth, and assorted greens.
