- The electricians have done some more work and our rail lights and phone lines are installed. When Doug returns from vacation he will finish installing the security system and audio system. Brandon and the town guys are working on installing the projection screen.
- Marie Gotti has agreed to start cleaning the library. She will charge \$95/week and comes highly recommended.
- August has kicked off with a bang here! Town is hopping, people are reading like crazy, and we are averaging more than 100 people a day through our doors. Blueberry Block Party was the busiest I've ever seen. The next downtown event is August 19 and we'll be celebrating a Mid Summer's Day Dream. There are plans for Fairy Houses, fairy flower wreaths, etc. The library will be hosting a craft on the lawn and will be a location for a fairy house for the scavenger hunt.
- Despite it being a rainy day, we had 14 people attend our first DIY project Beeswax Wraps. We had to meet outside, but the new pop-up tents the Friends purchased worked perfectly to keep us covered and keep the wax melting. Our next project is on Thursday, August 17th and we'll be crafting wreathes (really door hangers) made from Dollar Store pizza pans.
- Book Club met on July 19th with an attendance of 6 to discuss *Everyone in My Family Has Killed Someone*. Almost everyone enjoyed the tongue-in-cheek humor. In August, we'll be discussing *People We Meet on Vacation* by Emily Henry. Finally, a light beach read before we go into Recovery Month in September and Vermont Reads in October.
- We had a staff meeting Friday, August 4 to discuss a going away dinner for Linda. We also discussed the art of "reference interview," a term that describes the best way to interact with a library user to help them find the information they need.
- The elevator company came to do the yearly check on the lift and it worked well for them. It will be inspected in August.
- I'd like to contact a tree trimming service to look at the oak tree on the south side of the building. The branches are up against the building and on the roof.
- There are greens from the garden ready to go if anyone wants some. There are mustard greens, kale, collards, and romaine.

StoryWalk got off to a slow start. Our first day at the park, July 10 was pouring so we met at the library. There were 2 kids who joined me. The following week local summer camps were in full swing so we were competing with them. The final two weeks of July we had a few more kids. Several of those who joined us were visitors to Wilmington who were looking for fun activities for their young children.

The Library donated some books to the Park's Little Library. They were very appreciative.

Ed Pops's Amazing **Flea Circus** returned after about five years. Beaver Brook Camp and Wilmington Rec brought their kids. We had **53 attendees** ranging in age from preschool through adult. Ed was very well received.
