RE: <u>Old Firehouse Use</u>

Since July 2022, the town offered to share the community room at the Old Firehouse as a "hub" and learning center for social services and non-profits to meet with residents living in Wilmington and the Deerfield Valley. This is a shared space that is booked by the Office of the Town Manager. Also, the town rents two bays to commercial businesses and those revenues help to off-set the costs of operating the building. At the present time the space is shared by Voices of Hope, Senior Solutions, SEVCA and AA.

<u>Voices of Hope</u> stepped up in the early planning stages to say that they could use the space to operate as a home base for folks to meet, who live/work in the area, to help individuals in their recovery, while supporting families. <u>VoH is scheduled Mon-Fri</u>, each week. VoH provided the Selectboard an overview of how they could make use of the space early in the process and has provided a written update for you (attached).

Senior Solutions holds two "drop in" sessions each month for assistance with a variety of applications. They came forward early on since they needed space to meet with senior citizens and found the first-floor access with a short walk from the parking area to be beneficial to their clients. "Since we began last August, we have assisted 138 residents from Wilmington and surrounding towns in a total of programs, including 3SquaresVT food assistance, Seasonal Fuel assistance, Farm to Family Coupons, Case Management, Medicare, Homestead Exemption Assistance, Meals on Wheels applications, minor Home Repair, Green Mountain Power Electric discounts, Veterinary Care financial assistance, and sponsoring one individual to become a Certified Walk With Ease group leader."

<u>AA – Wilmington Group</u> meets in-person every Friday at 7:15 p.m. In talking with a supporter of AA, they find the space to be easily accessible with ample parking, which has improved their participation, averaging **25-30 visitors weekly**. Open meetings are available to anyone interested in Alcoholics Anonymous' program of recovery from alcoholism. Non-alcoholics may attend open meetings as observers.

<u>SEVCA</u> – is scheduled for once per month, thus far. SEVCA works to find solutions to the deep-seated problems of poverty, largely by empowering and collaborating with those whose lives are affected by it daily. We address people's immediate needs for fuel, housing, food, and other

essentials to help stabilize their lives in the short term, and provide further tools and support to help them achieve greater financial independence in the longer term.

Two bays are set aside for <u>town storage</u>: Beautification Committee (i.e., barrels, 4<sup>th</sup> of July and winter decorations); Library (i.e. books and furniture, recently); Wastewater Treatment Facility (i.e. hydro jetter); Highway (i.e. Bobcat); old Firehouse (i.e., tables and chairs); the bays are also used to piece together holiday decorations (i.e., wreaths).

There are <u>two businesses renting space</u> in two bays that results in \$6,100 in rental income annually.



Voices of Hope is a grassroots group who works in the Deerfield Valley to inspire hope and actively support people affected by substance use. We advocate to increase local resources and raise awareness about substance misuse and the importance of compassion in the Deerfield Valley. We do this by bringing resources, information, harm reduction and recovery support to the Deerfield Valley.

Our partners include among others, Deerfield Community Partnership, Turning Point of Windham County, the AIDS Project of Southern VT, Vermont Department of Health, The Rotary Club of the Deerfield Valley, Deerfield Valley Lions Club, Pettee Memorial Library, West Dover Congregational Church, Brattleboro Area Hospice and the towns of Wilmington, Whitingham and West Dover. Additional partners we started working with this year include: NAMI, United Way, SEVCA, Senior Solutions.

Funding from the State and Turning Point allows for a part-time Coordinator, Robin Rieske and a Recovery Support Services Coordinator, Elizabeth McEwen.

### Below is an update of our activities and services over the past year:

- We continue our important work of distributing Narcan, reducing stigma and building capacity. We also hired a part-time coordinator, adopted a fiscal agency relationship with the United Way and Turning Point of Windham County. We further developed our Facebook and Web presence.
- •Through funding from the Turning Point Recovery Center, we have an official Recovery Support Services Coordinator, and through a generous offer from the town of Wilmington, we continue our use of the Old Firehouse at no cost to offer groups, support, and open hours to drop-in. (712 people were served directly at the Firehouse from Jan to August in 2023). This includes a variety of support groups including Recovery groups, Family Connection and community events.
- We continue fundraising efforts through grants, events and funding from the Opioid Settlement fund. Community donations have also helped support our efforts.
- We held our Third memorial event co-hosted byBrattleboro Area Hospice. 20 community members, including those who have lost a loved one to substance use joined this powerful event.
- Presentations were made to the Marlboro, Readsboro and Whitingham Selectboard and community trainings were offered on understanding stigma, Multiple roots of addiction, the Power of Dignity.
- Under the leadership of Cheryl Rusin, Cathy Quigley, we distributed Narcan rescue packages, and cabinets and implemented Narcan administration training with over many local businesses, local home associations, Hotels, businesses, Ski Resorts, Ski patrollers, and schools.
- In partnership with Health Resources in Action, we sponsored a focus group with local residents about community needs and Helplink. Helplink is a free resource for Vermonters, providing confidential, non-judgmental support and referrals to treatment, recovery, and other services.
- We have resources including dedicated volunteers; grant writers; and technical assistance and support from the many partners mentioned above and the Town of Wilmington.
- We have a window display at the Shaw's parking lot next to the Community Bank in addition to multiple sites for outreach and posting information.
