


## Would you attend a public forum on the town's Hazard Mitigation Plan? 52 responses




## Of the following list of disasters, what are the top THREE that you are MOST concerned about? 52 responses



## Of the following list of disasters, what are the top THREE that you are LEAST concerned about? 50 responses




## Is your home at risk for any of the following disasters? 40 responses

Which of the following mitigation project types do you believe local government agencies should focus on to reduce disruptions of services and to strengthen the community (please check all that apply):

- Retrofit and strengthen essential facilities such as police, fire, emergency medical services, hospitals, schools, etc. (26, 52%)
- Replace inadequate or vulnerable bridges and causeways.(31, 62%)
- Retrofit infrastructure, such as elevating roadways and improving drainage systems.(27, 54%)
- Work on improving the damage resistance of utilities (electricity, communications, water / wastewater facilities, etc.). (31, 62%)
- Install or improve protective structures, such as floodwalls or levees. (22, 44%)
- Buyout flood prone properties and maintain as open-space. (10, 20%)
- Strengthen codes, ordinances, and plans to require higher hazard risk management standards. (13, 26%)
- Provide better information about hazard risk and high-hazard areas. (13, 26%)
- Inform property owners of ways they can mitigate damage to their properties. (25, 50%)
- Assist vulnerable property owners with securing funding to mitigate impacts to their property(s). (21, 42%)
- Improve local emergency shelter facilities (8, 16%)
