Kathleen will do any reporting to Vermont Humanities, confirm with the Maritime Museum presenter and shared an edited chronology per a Google Doc.

Lenny is researching the history of Medburyville and its 1865-1925 schoolhouse, 20 houses in the beginning, some lost with the flooding of the reservoir, there was a mill at the picnic area. He will be able to produce a sheet and map of the history that can be shared within one of the displays.
